

Paul Haley has been the Emergency Management Coordinator for the City of Trenton, Michigan since 1987. The mission of the Emergency Management Department is to provide an organized, coordinated response in the event of an emergency situation or disaster. Paul plans exercises with both city departments and private sector organizations such as local hospitals, power plants, chemical facilities, and schools. He has worked with FEMA over snow emergencies, the August 2003 power blackout, and resident evacuations.

Paul has worked extensively with the Office of Domestic Preparedness – Department of Homeland Security assessment tools and conducted risk analyses with the Emergency Management Division of the Michigan State Police. Paul is the 2000 recipient of the Michigan Emergency Management Association's Emergency Coordinator of the Year award.

Paul was the Navy Emergency Planning Liaison Officer to Governor Engler for three years and worked on various operational exercises that addressed emergency issues. He is a retired Navy Captain.
